

## 2008 Tournament Rates

100 + players	\$28.75/player (plus 6% sales tax)
40 to 99 players	\$40.25/player (plus 6% sales tax)
39 or less players	\$63.00/player (plus 6% sales tax)

The Board of Directors of Avondale will consider requests for rates, other than those listed above, on a case-by-case basis.

## Tournament Policies

- 1) All tournament chairpersons are required to fill out and return the tournament contract to the golf professional (attached).
- 2) All tournament fees, including food/beverage concessions must be paid the day of play, unless prior arrangements have been made and approved on the tournament contract.
- 3) Shotgun tournaments must have a minimum of and pay for 72 players, unless approved by the Board of Directors.
- 4) No outside food or beverages will be allowed without the consent of the food and beverage manager or Board of Directors. Absolutely no outside alcohol will be allowed. Tournaments must adhere to all Alcohol Beverage Control (ABC) regulations.
- 5) All prizes and awards shall be purchased through the Pro Shop. Tournament sponsoring organization may provide some unique prizes for its participants.
- 6) Reservations for more than 25 carts must be made 45 days in advance, as carts will have to be leased to accommodate the tournament. Cost of fleet carts is \$35.00/cart.
- 7) All unused tournament times on the day of play will be filled from the waiting list, whenever possible, without reimbursement to the tournament organization for the resold starting times.
- 8) If, on the day of the tournament the course is closed, or deemed unplayable by the greens superintendent, the green fees, will be refunded if no players have commenced play.
- 9) Tournament participants must observe all prevailing rules and regulations covering the use of the golf course, personal conduct, dress code and golf play.
- 10) The tournament-sponsoring organization is liable for any personal injury, property damages or repairs resulting from tournament play.
- 11) The tournament director must provide help in cleaning up any debris left on the golf course as a result of their tournament.
- 12) The tournament-sponsoring organization agrees that during the use of the facilities, no person will be excluded from participation, denied any benefit, or otherwise be subjected to discrimination because of his/her race, creed, color or national origin.
- 13) Any tournament, which does not otherwise conform to these guidelines, may have the right to appeal to the Board of Directors who may, with the advice of the club pro, overrule any provision of this policy.

## Golf Course Policies

- 1) All play shall start at #1 tee, unless otherwise allowed by the club pro.
- 2) Every paid golfer, including those with season passes, must register in the Pro Shop before teeing off.
- 3) All players must have a current cash register receipt or a valid membership card in their possession during play.
- 4) All golf course play is under the direction and supervision of the club pro. The Pro Shop shall keep the schedule of starting times. Reservations may be made no more than one week in advance.
- 5) Fivesomes will be permitted at the discretion of the Pro Shop.
- 6) The course marshal is empowered to require slower groups to allow following groups to play through. In the absence of a course marshal, slower players must let faster players through. Breach of golf etiquette will be reported to the golf professional, and reported to the Board of Directors for disciplinary action.
- 7) Twosomes will be paired to make a foursome at the discretion of the Pro Shop.
- 8) Children 5 years of age and under are not allowed on the golf course. Children 6 to 11 years of age are allowed on the golf course with adult supervision. Children 6 to 11 years of age will be allowed on the golf course without adult supervision when they have demonstrated to the golf pro an appropriate knowledge of golf etiquette and play. These children will be under the indirect supervision of the golf pro and may be removed from the course at any time.
- 9) Players are to adhere to a dress code.
- 10) Every player shall have a set of clubs and a bag.
- 11) Holes must be played in sequence, and a golfer in the wrong fairway must give way to the players playing the proper hole.
- 12) In the interest of all, players must play without delay, and all groups must keep their place on the course or allow following players to play through. Golfers taking a break after 9 holes should move quickly enough or they will lose their position of play on the golf course.
- 13) Players should replace all divots, repair ball marks on greens, rake sand traps and use sand and seed mixture on tees where provided and keep sand and seed containers on carts.
- 14) Players should tee up between markers only.
- 15) Practicing anywhere on the golf course at any time is prohibited. Players must use the designated areas for practice.
- 16) Pull carts shall be kept off tees and greens and out of sand traps.
- 17) All golfers are expected to act in a courteous and orderly manner while on the course or in the Clubhouse. Intoxication, disorderly conduct, use of abusive or profane language, or other behavior detrimental to the normal orderly operation of the golf course will be cause for removal.
- 18) The golf professional, course marshal or greens superintendent has the right to remove from the course any person in violation of any of the above rules.

## Power Cart Policies

- 1) Keep 30 feet from tees, greens traps and aprons or stay on cart paths.
- 2) Power carts will not be rented to anyone suspected of being under the influence of alcohol or drugs and will be rented only to persons with a valid driver's license and who is at least 16 years of age.
- 3) No more than two power carts shall be used in each foursome or smaller group. If fivesomes are permitted, **the number of power carts per group shall be subject to the determination of the Pro Shop.**
- 4) Obey all posted signs.
- 5) Anyone operating either a private or rental cart must have a valid driver's license and be at least 16 years of age. Persons 12 to 15 years of age may drive a power cart provided an adult at least 18 years of age accompanies them.
